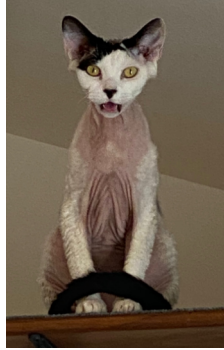

Cats



Vincent — The more bold of the kitten brothers.



Basil — Shy and always hungry.

Both cats are **indoor-only**.

The two cats are brothers and are $\frac{3}{4}$ Sphynx. They're friendly and sweet, but can sometimes play a little rough with each other.

Food & Medicine

Food: They get fed twice a day. For each meal, use one scoop of dry food and split a half can of wet food between the two bowls. That's a total of one can per day. There's a little plastic cover to put on the can after the morning meal to save it in the fridge for dinner.

Additional cat food is in the utility room.

The cats *do not* get to eat "people food."

We usually feed them at 7am & 6pm, but this is super flexible.

Water: Top up water bowl as needed. Clean as needed.

Meds: No meds at this time.

House

The **litter box** needs scooping once every day or two. Clean litter is in the black/yellow bucket. More in the utility room. Used litter goes in the square bucket by the kitchen trash. When that's full, it can go out to the grey trash bin on the driveway. Refill bucket liners are in the cat food drawer.

Please bring in any **mail**, newspapers, or packages that got delivered to the mailbox/porch of the main house.

Lights and sprinklers are pre-programmed.

Trash & recycling go in the bins (through the gate at the top of the driveway). If the big blue recycling bin is full, please put it out at the curb Sunday evening, for the Monday morning pick-up.

Emergencies

Cat carriers (backpack and box) are in the closet.
